CODE OF CONDUCT

The goal of **Glasgow Gladiators** is to create a lively sporting environment, and to promote the spirit of the game, through the exclusion of unethical behaviour, which will not be tolerated.

I the athlete/coach and volunteer agree to the following:

- 1. Treat all others as you would like to be treated, with integrity politeness and admiration.
- 2. Practice, play and spectate within the spirit of the game.
- 3. Help each other to learn new skills.
- 4. Compete as individuals.
- 5. Give respect to others coaches, officials, other players, team managers, parents who help organise, officiate and play the sport.
- 6. Accept final decisions from event referee, court umpires and officials.
- 7. Do not direct verbal, physical, emotional abuse towards opponents/coaches/umpires/partners/event organisers & other team members.
- 8. Arrive 30 minutes before the start of play each day to ensure adequate preparation and to be punctual on all occasions, inform event organisers of any injuries which may cause you to withdraw from matches.
- 9. Respect when officials are working and that their busy role in assisting with the event delivery may make them inaccessible at some times.
- 10. Respect that the taking of photographs is to be done only with the appropriate accreditation and at times which are appropriate during the event or highlighted by the event organisers as not disturbing competitors or officials.

Glasgow Gladiators Boccia Open Competition Conditions:

- 1. The tournament will be run in accordance with the Tournament Regulation of Scottish Disability Sport.
- 2. All competitors must have an understanding of the rules of Boccia and have played the sport prior to the tournament.
- 3. All competitors must bring their own ramps and other devices which may be used to propel the ball. Boccia sets will be available at the venue for competitors to borrow.
- 4. Competitors must be a member of a Boccia Club or individually affiliated to their local branch associated to Scottish Disability Sport.
- 5. Competitors must be eligible to play Boccia, according to the Boccia International Sports Federation Classification guidelines. A copy of the guidelines can be obtained from the BISFed website (www.BISFed.com)
- 6. All competitors who have not previously entered a Boccia tournament must consent to undergoing the classification process set out in the BISFed Classification guidelines. All competitors must fit into one of the tournaments classification categories. If a competitor is deemed ineligible under these guidelines by a trained medical classifier, they will be excluded from the tournament.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason and to alter or modify the programme in any way it sees fit. The committee's decision on all matters shall be final.
- 8. Entries must be made on the official form to the Tournament Secretary, with entry fees, by the stated closing date. If at its discretion the Tournament Organisers should accept entries and/or fees after this date, there will be a surcharge of £5.00 per player.
- 9. A competitor may enter in the classification group to which they are classified, but may play in a different classification group in the event of classification groups being merged. Classification groups will only be merged in the event of insufficient entries, and will be at the discretion of the Tournament Secretary.
- 10. Entry is at the competitor's own risk and by signing the entry form the competitor undertakes that to the best of their knowledge they are healthy to compete.
- 11. Glasgow Gladiators is committed to providing equal treatment for all its staff, volunteers, competitors and spectators in compliance with the Equality Act 2010.

- 12. Glasgow Gladiators will not be liable for any expense incurred as a result of this event being cancelled or postponed. All expenses are at the sole risk of the competitor.
- 13. **WITHDRAWAL.** Notification of withdrawal must be given immediately to the Tournament Secretary and confirmation must be sent in writing. Withdrawal during the Tournament must be notified to the Tournament Secretary. No refund is due if withdrawal is within 36 hours of the start of the tournament.
- 14. Competitors must be prepared to play at the times stated for the commencement of each event. Competitors will be advised by post or email of the time they are required for their first match in each event for which their entry has been accepted. If no such notification has been received four days prior to the tournament it is the responsibility of the competitor to enquire from Tournament Secretary (see front of the prospectus).
- 15. Competitors must report to Registration immediately upon arrival, and must not leave the venue without the Tournament Secretary's permission, until eliminated from all events. ANY COMPETITOR NOT READY TO PLAY WHEN CALLED UPON WILL BE LIABLE TO BE SCRATCHED AND/OR PENALISED.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

- If there are less than 5 players in any category, then the organising committee have the right to merge categories.
- The tournament will be run under the regulations of **BISFed** and **Scottish Disability Sport** standard regulations.
- All players who participate in the event must be affiliated to a Boccia Club or to their Local branch affiliated to Scottish Disability Sport.
- The coaching of players during games **will not be allowed** unless it it's strictly for the purpose of assistance and guidance.
- Scoring Group games semi-finals and finals will be the best to 4 ends Tiebreak end will be played if required.
- Please remember that photography is only permitted at the event if you have obtained permission from the Tournament Secretary. People wishing to do so may request a permit from registration.
- Players, Coaches, Officials, Parents and Volunteers shall be expected to abide by their governing bodies "Code of Conduct". Please ensure you refer to these conditions prior to the event.
- A cancellation fee shall also be levied at competitors who do not attend without suitable reason - A fee of £5 is payable if an entry is cancelled within 36 hours before the start of play. Full refunds will only be considered if applied for in writing within 14 days after the tournament

Please note that in <u>ALL</u> situations, the Referee's decision shall be final.
